Show Rules and Regulations:

- It is the responsibility of the exhibitor, parent, and/or trainer to read and understand the rules contained in this book, and to read and understand the eligibility and class/division requirements and qualifications before entering any classes.
- The Woodstock Fair Horse Show Staff and the Woodstock Agricultural Society, Inc. are not liable for injury, theft or damage to any person, property or animal. Signature on entry form constitutes agreement herein.
- 3. Judges' decisions are final. No exhibitor or person shall heckle or approach a judge for any reason. Permission to speak with a judge may be obtained from the Horse Show Supervisor or ring staff if the judge is agreeable. While the show is in progress, only authorized persons are permitted in the ring. Any exhibitor or representative disregarding this rule will cause the disqualification of the exhibitor, the forfeiture of all entry fees, and may be asked to leave the area. Show management reserves the right to change judging assignments.
- 4. Show Management decisions are final. No exhibitor or person shall behave in a disruptive manner towards show staff. Any exhibitor or representative disregarding this rule will cause the disqualification of the exhibitor, the forfeiture of all entry fees, and may be asked to leave the area.
- 5. Management reserves the right to cancel, combine, divide, limit size or move classes.
- 6. Failure to comply with the rules/regulations in effect will result in forfeiture of fees and expulsion from the Fairgrounds.
- 7. Rider's age will be the age they were on December 1, 2023.
- 8. The age of a horse shall be computed on the basis of a calendar year starting January 1 of the year foaled. It is a weanling during the calendar year of foaling date, regardless of the time of year foaled.
- 9. The following point system will be used: 1st: 10 points 2nd: 8 points 3rd: 7 points 4th: 6 points 5th: 5 points 6th: 4 points 7th: 3 points 8th: 2 points. Championship classes and Classics are worth double and Challenge and Premium Classics Classes are triple points.

- 10. Day-end and weekend division awards are based on a team of the same horse and rider, with the exception of the Registered breed divisions, which are based on the horse only.
- 11. Exhibitors must have proof of proper registration for horses being shown in Registered Breed classes.
- 12. Riders must have a number presented to the judge while exhibiting in a class. The number must be on the exhibitor or on both sides of the saddle pad, if using your own number system. Any exhibitor entering the ring without a number or wearing an incorrect number, will be disqualified.
- Any Exhibitor showing in a class they have not entered/added <u>will be charged double</u> the entry fee.
- 14. <u>2-minute tack change holds only for legitimate tack changes to be requested at the GATE.</u> Tack changes must be done at ringside and will not exceed 2 minutes. Please plan accordingly.
- 15. Bits may be checked at the discretion of the judge.
- 16. Cell phones or any other communication device are not allowed in the ring.
- 17. Headers are permitted and encouraged for Walk-Trot and Beginner exhibitors during the lineup, pinning and exit from the arena. With permission from the judge, any other rider may also use a header for assistance during line-up and pinning.
- 18. Schooling of horses is permitted only in authorized areas and times. No schooling or horses near the barns, spectator areas or concession area. Courteous behavior is expected from all exhibitors.
- 19. Action devices are prohibited anywhere on the show grounds.
- 20. All Hunt Seat riders are required to wear ASTM approved helmets with a harness whenever riding over fences.
- 21. All riders must have appropriate footwear whenever mounted.
- 22. No person can ride bareback or with halter and lead lines on the fairgrounds. Riding double is expressly prohibited.
- 23. NO STALLIONS! NO EXCEPTIONS!

- 24. The following are prohibited and cause for expulsion from the fairgrounds and forfeiture of fees:
 - + Alcoholic beverages are not permitted on the premises.
 - + Smoking is not permitted in the tents or stalls.
 - + Grilling or open fires are not permitted anywhere in or around the tents and stalls.
 - + Personal golf carts, motor scooters,
 - 4-wheelers, ATVs, or skateboards are not allowed.
 - +Harassment, heckling, taunting, abusive behavior and/or foul language will not be tolerated
 - +Abuse of horses will not be tolerated.
- 25. No dogs are allowed on the horse show grounds. **PLEASE LEAVE YOUR DOGS AT HOME**.
- 26. The exhibitor must clean up after their horse and deposit manure in the designated area.

as well as the show office.

- +If you sublet a stall to someone you must notify the show office in writing by August 28, 2024 with who the exhibitor is and what the horse name is. All rules apply. You will still be the responsible party for that stall.
- +Any exhibitor using a stall not assigned/sublet to them or tampering with the stall assignments, will be charged a **\$275.00** fee and must vacate the stall.
- + No person shall enter any stall other than their own without the express permission of the owner.
- + Stalls will be of the shed row type. There is no dismantling of the stalls for any reason including stall decorating.
- + Stalls are available Thursday, August 29 at 8:00am for decorating, deliveries of equipment, and supplies. Horses can move in at 12PM. Stalls must be vacated by Monday September 2 at 8:00pm.
- + No mounting or riding of horses in the tent aisles or stalls. No use of whips in the stalls or aisles.
- + All horse trailers will be parked in a designated area on Stonebridge Rd. All horses must be stabled after show hours.
- + No temporary paddocks are allowed.
- + Do not overload or tamper with electrical outlets and/or stall lighting, or you will be asked to leave

- the show grounds. Do not use extension cords in an unsafe manner.
- + Hosing/washing of horses must be done in the wash area. Do not bathe horses near the stalls. Do not tie your horse to water pipes.
- + Shavings bags are recyclable. Please put shavings bags in the designated location; do not discard them in rubbish containers.
- +All stalls must be stripped clean prior to vacating. Failure to remove all waste will result in an increased stall fees for future shows.

Parking:

- +Once unloaded, empty trailers will be parked in the Stonebridge lot. They cannot remain on the horse show grounds. Please plan accordingly for tack storage needs.
- + Only pre-entered exhibitors with horses stabled on the grounds are entitled to one 4-day Fair parking sticker. Parking passes will be handed out at the gate and signed for upon arrival. Lost or forgotten parking passes will not be replaced. The parking sticker MUST be affixed to the lower left corner of the windshield. Stickers not affixed will not be accepted.
- + All Trainers will receive 1 parking pass whether exhibiting or not.
- + Multiple vehicles accompanying the exhibitor will **not** be issued a parking sticker.
- + All day trailers must be parked in the designated area and will be charged a \$10.00/day parking fee at the gate.
- + Cars accompanying a day trailer will be directed to park in the parking area and pay the \$5.00 parking fee at the gate.
- + All vehicles must be parked as directed by the Parking Department.
- + Parking of vehicles will not be allowed in any of the stall/barn areas at any time.
- + Vehicle access for unloading of grain, hay, etc. will be allowed prior to 7:00 a.m. Please plan accordingly.
- + Trailer access to load/unload horses in the stall/barn area while the show is in progress is **prohibited.**
- + Trailers arriving during show hours will need to unload in the Day Parking Area.
- + Failure to comply will result in forfeiture of fees and expulsion from the Woodstock Fair.

SUBJECT: Livestock Health Certificates for the 2024 Show Season- New England

DATE: January 24, 2024

Special Notices: Due to the continuing US outbreak of High Path Avian Influenza (HPAI), Animal Health Officials from all six New England States may recommend postponing competitions, exhibitions, shows, swaps, or other in-person events encouraging the gathering or co-mingling of domestic fowl or poultry. If events are held, best practices for biosecurity should be implemented.

Contact the state where animals will be exhibited for the latest updated information.

Currently an Official Certificate of Veterinary Inspection (OCVI) is required for each state for every animal movement across state lines. Animals crossing state lines must be properly (officially) identified per federal and state Animal Disease Traceability (ADT) requirements. Each state to which an animal travels needs to be contacted to verify that all traceability and movement permit requirements are met before shipping.

Recognizing that during the agriculture and fair and show season exhibition animals may be moving to multiple states and locations within a state, the New England state veterinarians, working through the New England States Animal Agricultural Security Alliance (NESAASA), have developed a new protocol to facilitate animal movement. The New England State Veterinarians have agreed to allow a show/fair certificate to be valid for the show season provided they are in compliance with all federal and state ADT rules.

One Official Certificate of Veterinary Inspection (OCVI) may be allowed for animals of the same species to be exhibited at fairs or shows in any of the New England states (CT, *ME, MA, **NH, RI, and ***VT) when submitted with an itinerary of the dates and locations of the events at which the listed animals are expected to be shown. Only animals that are healthy at the time of shipment may be moved.

Note that *ME, **NH, and ***VT have additional requirements. Certificates of veterinary inspection in these states are valid for a shorter time and may have additional language, movement, and permit requirements. See details below.

For the 2024 Show and Fair Season, livestock animals being exhibited in New England states must have official certificates of veterinary inspection (OCVIs) that meet the following requirements: 2024 NE Exhibition Health Certificate Rules 2 of 3

Requirements, Continued:

- CT, MA, ME, and RI: OCVIs issued on or after January 1, 2024, may be used for animals being shown at fairs and shows in CT, MA, ME, and RI through the 2024 show/fair season ending October 31, 2024. o Special Note on The Big E, West Springfield, MA: All bovines must have official USDA RFID tags.
- *CT and ME: An importation permit for exhibition animals is also required. Contact CT Dept. of Agriculture (860-713-2504) or ME State Veterinarian's Office (207-287-3701) for permits or questions.
- * * NH: Animals exhibited in NH must originate in a New England state and move on OCVIs issued on or after April 1, 2024, to participating NH fairs and shows from July 1 to October 31, 2024. Contact NH State Veterinarian's Office (603) 271-2404 for details and permits.
- ***VT: The fair season is defined as May 1- October 31, 2024. Contact the VT Animal Health Office (802-828-2421) for specific import requirements and permits.
- A single OCVI from the animals' home state may be completed for travel to and from the New England states in which the animals will be exhibited.
- Multiple animals of the same species may be listed on one health certificate with appropriate individual IDs and descriptions. Animals of different species may not be listed on the same official health certificate.
- An itinerary of the names and locations for each New England fair or show at which owner expects to show the listed animals and the dates when each animal is expected to be on each site, must be prepared by the owner and presented to the veterinarian at the time the OCVI is written.
 - o A copy of this planned itinerary must be attached to the official health certificate (import and export) for it to be used for more than one fair or show.
 - o That proposed list should be signed by the veterinarian and the owner/ exhibitor and reference the relevant OCVI number(s).
- The name and address of the first show or fair where the listed animals will be exhibited is to be used as the "destination" on the OCVI form. In addition, "See attached list" or a similar statement directing Animal Health Officials or Fair Inspectors to the attached proposed itinerary must be included.
- Exhibitors must keep an accurate list of the show locations and dates when their animals were physically on the show/fairgrounds. This record must be available to fair inspectors at each inspection and check- in.
- Any animal listed on an OCVI that becomes sick must remain home. If the animal is refused entry to any exhibition during 2024 for health reasons it must have a new health certificate issued by an accredited veterinarian within 30 days of the next interstate movement.
- Any New England state may end their participation in this agreement and revert to the standard published requirements for livestock imports in the state at any time, in the event of foreign animal disease outbreak or changes to state legislation. 2024 NE Exhibition Health Certificate Rules 3 of 3

Remember: One certificate for shows in CT, MA, ME, NH, RI, and VT. Contact each state for specific requirements. Import permits are issued by each individual state and must be listed on the OCVI. The list of events, with dates and locations, where the animals are expected to be shown must accompany the OCVI. Use one certificate per species. All animals must be listed individually, with appropriate official ID numbers and physical descriptions.

Sick animals may not be shipped anywhere.

60. Lucy Tisdale Memorial Hunter Derby Challenge

This is a two round class open to anyone to be shown over a course of ten fences at 2'6" with higher options. The first round judged on performance, hunter pace, and style, quality and substance, and movement. The course should include at least one in and out, one bending line and one unrelated distance. The obstacles are to simulate those found in a hunt field. Natural obstacles may be used. The top 4 or 25% from the first will return to jump a handy hunter round of eight obstacles which may include at least two of the following: trot jump, tight turn option, clever options for jump approach, halt and/or back and walk jump. To be judged on style, brilliance, and handiness. The score will be a total of the two rounds. To fill a class, at least 4 riders must compete.

RING 2

192. Versatility Horse Challenge:

Open to all exhibitors. This class will be run in three sections - gymkhana, western pleasure and Hunter Hack. Following the Western portion there will be a timed 3-minute break to prepare for tack and attire change inside of the show ring. ASTM approved helmets with harnesses required for Hunter Hack. Grooms are to be ready at the gate. **No more than three grooms will be allowed to assist each rider.**

- 14. Open Tag Team 3-Barrel Premium Classic: Average time for both riders on the team will determine placing. Enter under one exhibitor's number.
- 33. Youth Walk-Trot Pleasure Classic: Open to Walk-Trot exhibitors ages 17 & under in all disciplines.
- 34. Beginner Walk-Trot-Canter Pleasure Classic
- **35. Pro-Am Walk-Trot Equitation Premium Classic:** A walk-trot Classic open to all exhibitors in all disciplines. Professionals ride the first way of the ring, and amateurs ride the second way of the ring. Only the pros and amateurs are allowed into the ring during the class. The non-mounted rider will remain in the middle of the ring while the mounted rider is competing. Communication is NOT permitted at ANY point between riders. - **137. Gamblers Choice Classic:** Open to all exhibitors. Jumps will be marked with point values. Exhibitors make their own course with a max time of 55 seconds after which they have the choice to jump the JOKER. The joker is the highest point value and the only jump that deducts points for a rail or refusal. Each jump can only be jumped 2 times. Jumps must be jumped in the correct direction only.

The **Hi Point Trainer** award is based on the **total** points earned by all their students in **all** classes entered. This is not a team award and all classes count; regardless of how many horses/ponies/Students a trainer may have. Trainer does not need to be present at the time of the presentation to win these awards.

The **Hi Point Exhibitor** award is based on the **total** points earned by an exhibitor in **all** classes entered. This is not a team award and all classes count; regardless of how many horses/ponies an exhibitor may ride/drive/exhibit. Exhibitors need not be present at the time of the presentation to win these awards.

The **Hi Point Horse** award is based on the **total** points earned by a horse in **all** classes entered. This is not a team award and all classes count; regardless of how many exhibitors/handlers ride/drive/exhibit the horses. Horse need not be present at the time of the presentation to win these awards.

The **Hi Point Pony** award is based on the **total** points earned by a pony in **all** classes entered. This is not a team award and all classes count; regardless of how many exhibitors/handlers ride/drive/exhibit the pony. Pony need not be present at the time of the presentation to win these awards.

Description: Ranch Horse measures a horse's ability to be a pleasure to ride while performing one ranch task to another. These horses should exhibit versatility, attitude, and movement of a working horse. They should have the ability to work at a forward working speed while demonstrating obvious lengthening of stride at extended gaits. Horses should be ridden with light contact or on a loose rein but not on a full drape. Posting or standing in the stirrups at extended jog is acceptable. Pattern class can include but not limited to changes of gait, lead changes (simple or flying), changes of direction, back, 360 degree turns and extension of gait. Rail class will be judged on walk, jog, lope with extensions in both jog and lope in at least one direction. Other movements which may be asked at the judge's discretion is but not limited to: halt, stop, back, one change of direction at the jog, side pass, turns of 360 degrees, or change of lead. Passing of horses is permissible and should not be penalized if the horse maintains rhythm and cadence.
