Show Rules and Regulations:

1. It is the responsibility of the exhibitor, parent, and/or trainer to read and understand the rules contained in this book and to read and understand the eligibility and class/division requirements and qualifications before entering any classes.
2. The Woodstock Fair Horse Show Staff and the Woodstock Agricultural Society, Inc. are not liable for injury, theft, or damage to any person, property, or animal. Signature on entry form constitutes agreement herein.
3. **Judges' decisions are final.** No exhibitor or person shall heckle or approach a judge for any reason. Permission to speak with a judge may be obtained from the Horse Show Supervisor or ring staff if the judge is agreeable. While the show is in progress, only authorized persons are permitted in the ring. Any exhibitor or representative disregarding this rule will cause the disqualification of the exhibitor, the forfeiture of all entry fees, and may be asked to leave the area. Show management reserves the right to change judging assignments.
4. **Show Management decisions are final.** No exhibitor or person shall behave in a disruptive manner towards show staff. Any exhibitor or representative disregarding this rule will cause the disqualification of the exhibitor, the forfeiture of all entry fees, and may be asked to leave the area.
5. Management reserves the right to cancel, combine, divide, limit size, or move classes.
6. Failure to comply with the rules/regulations in effect will result in forfeiture of fees and expulsion from the Fairgrounds.
7. The rider's age will be the age they were on December 1, 2024.
8. The age of a horse shall be computed based on a calendar year starting January 1 of the year foaled. It is a weanling during the calendar year of the foaling date, regardless of the time of year it was foaled.
9. The following point system will be used:
1st: 10 points 2nd: 8 points 3rd: 7 points 4th: 6 points 5th: 5 points 6th: 4 points 7th: 3 points 8th: 2 points. Championship and Classics are worth double, and Challenge and Premium Classics Classes are worth triple points.

Medal and Derby Classes are: 1st 10 points 2nd 6 points 3rd: 4 points 4th: 2 points 5th: 1 points 6th: 0.5 points

10. **Day-end and weekend division** awards are based on a **team** of the same horse and rider, with the exception of the Registered breed divisions, which are based on the horse only.
11. Exhibitors must have proof of proper registration for horses being shown in Registered Breed classes.
12. Riders must have a number presented to the judge while exhibiting in a class. The number must be on the exhibitor or both sides of the saddle pad if you use your own number system. **Any exhibitor entering the ring without a number or wearing an incorrect number will be disqualified.**
13. Any Exhibitor showing in a class they have not entered/added **will be charged double** the entry fee.
14. **2-minute tack change holds only for legitimate tack changes to be requested at the GATE.** Tack changes must be done at ringside and will not exceed 2 minutes. Please plan accordingly.
15. Bits may be checked at the discretion of the judge.
16. Cell phones or any other communication devices are not allowed in the ring.
17. Headers are permitted and encouraged for Walk-Trot and Beginner exhibitors during the lineup, pinning, and exit from the arena. With permission from the judge, any other rider may also use a header for assistance during line-up and pinning.
18. The schooling of horses is permitted only in authorized areas and times. No schooling of horses near the parking, spectator areas, or concession area. Courteous behavior is expected from all exhibitors.
19. Open Warm up in Ring 1 from 6:45 - 8:15 am. 5 horses at a time. Will be charged as a one time fee for the day if entered in classes in Ring 1.
20. Blue/Red Warm up trip: Open to anyone as a schooling class. Will be given a blue or red as a score. No ribbons in this class. It can be ridden once per height change. Course will be posted.

21. No warm up for grass ring classes.
22. Action devices are prohibited anywhere on the showgrounds.
23. All Hunt Seat riders are required to wear ASTM/SEI-approved helmets with a harness whenever riding over fences.
24. All riders must have appropriate footwear whenever mounted.
25. No person can ride bareback or with halter and lead lines on the fairgrounds. Riding double is expressly prohibited.
26. Stallions may be shown/handled by exhibitors over 18.
27. The following are prohibited and cause for expulsion from the fairgrounds and forfeiture of fees:
 - + Alcoholic beverages are not permitted on the premises.
 - + Harassment, heckling, taunting, abusive behavior, and/or foul language will not be tolerated
 - + Abuse of horses will not be tolerated.
28. No dogs are allowed near the show rings.
29. The exhibitor must clean up after their horse and deposit manure in the designated area.

+ Classes will have limits of 18 for walk trot, beginner, and green horse classes in Ring 2 and Hunter Type Walk Trot in Ring 1. Class limits for all other classes will be 25 in Ring 2 and 28 in Ring 1.

FUN & GAMES DIVISION

Personal Appointments/Tack: English or Western attire is allowed in Fun & Games classes.

Egg & Spoon: Each rider is given an egg & spoon. The egg may be held in place with the thumb until the class begins. Once the class begins, the spoon must be held at least 1" from the bowl. As eggs are dropped, riders are eliminated. Touching the egg or not doing the requested gait/action is a disqualification.

Mint Julep: Each rider is given a cup of water. The class is worked for a set amount of time. Not doing the requested gait/action is a disqualification. At the end of the time, winners are based on who has the most amount of water left in his or her cup.

Command: This is an elimination contest where any rider not executing the judge's exact commands promptly and correctly will be eliminated. Delivery of commands will be at the show's discretion and explained to all prior to start.

GYMKHANA DIVISIONS

Timing: To be done by an electric timer located at the start/finish line. Failure of electrical devices will result in taking time by stopwatch.

Start/Finish: Starts and finishes are in the ring with the gate closed.

Restrictions/Disqualification: Excessive use of whip/bat or spurs on any horse or pony in or out of the ring, not following the pattern, fall of horse or rider, spurring or whipping in front of the girth, or unsoundness of horse in or out of the ring. You must cross the starting line within two (2) minutes after your number is called to ride, or you will be disqualified.

Woodstock Fair Equitation O/F Medals

The class consists of two phases. The first phase is over obstacles, and the second phase is on the flat, with each phase counting 50%. To win a ribbon, a rider must complete both phases. The judge will select at least six contestants, if available, to compete in the second phase at a walk, trot, and canter. The same horse/pony shall be shown by the same rider in all phases. For any class to count, at least three riders must complete both phases of the class. Exhibitors may compete in only one Medal Class.

Hunt n Go Derby

This is a two-round class open to amateur adults and junior riders to be shown over a course of eight to ten fences at 2'6" with higher options. The first round judged on performance, hunter pace and style, quality and substance, and movement. The course should include at least one in and out, one bending line, and one unrelated distance. The obstacles are to simulate those found in a hunt field. Natural obstacles may be used. The top four or 25% from the first round will return to jump a handy hunter round of six to eight obstacles, which may include at least two of the following: trot jump, tight turn option, clever options for jump approach, and halt and/or back. To be judged on style, brilliance, and handiness. Judges will adhere to USHJA Hunter Derby rules for scoring. The score will be a total of the two rounds. To fill a class, at least four horses must compete.

Woodstock Fair Flat Equitation Medal

Open to Junior or Amateur adults. All contestants are to show at the walk, trot and canter both ways of the ring. To fill a class, three (3) competitors must show and be judged with proper appointments. At least the top four contestants are then required to perform one of the following tests.

Test A On the straight away of the ring ONLY: Trot the first 1/3 on the correct diagonal; Canter the second 1/3 on the correct lead; Trot the final 1/3 on the incorrect diagonal. Return to lineup at a trot down either rail.

Test B Trot to the center of the far end of the ring demonstrating two changes of diagonal. TEST A end trot on incorrect diagonal canter trot start Canter a Circle Trot down the other side of the ring back to the lineup at a sitting trot. TEST B canter circle sitting trot lineup

LEADLINE DIVISIONS

Open to riders ages 2-7 as of December 1, 2024, who have never competed in any class other than Leadline. Open to all disciplines. Riders will be required to direct their mounts; handler interference will be penalized. No covered stirrups allowed. A halter over or under the bridle is mandatory. The handler must be 16 years of age or older. The trail class will consist of no more than four (4) obstacles. Side walkers and grab straps are permitted for age 2-4 classes. The degree of use may be penalized at the judge's discretion.

Open Driving

Open to all horses, ponies, minis, and drivers regardless of status. One attendant without a whip will be permitted for each entry. Entries to be shown to a suitable 2 or 4 wheeled vehicles with an appropriate harness. Required gaits shall be the walk/ flat walk, working trot/pleasure trot, and extended trot/road trot. When asked to extend the trot, entries should show both speed and form. All drivers (Jr. or Sr.) may have an adult passenger at their option.

79. Pleasue Driving - The pleasure driving equine should be light mouthed and capable of being taken up at any time, willing to walk and stand quietly and to back easily and readily.

80. Reinsmanship -This class is designed to test the driver's knowledge of driving techniques and his or her ability to put that knowledge to use to present a proficient performance. Patterns are required.

81. Obstacle Driving - Not timed, and to be judged similar to an In-Hand Obstacle/Trail class

REGISTERED BREED DIVISIONS

Entries must include registration papers. Only a full registered name of the horse will be allowed on the show entry form. Registration papers must accompany entry. If a horse/pony is under one year of age, the exhibitor must show proof that registration is being processed. Neat, appropriate attire for any in-hand class is required.
