Show Rules and Regulations:

1. **It is the responsibility of the exhibitor, parent, and/or trainer to read and understand the rules contained in this book, and to read and understand the eligibility and class/division requirements and qualifications before entering any classes.**
2. The Woodstock Fair Horse Show Staff and the Woodstock Agricultural Society, Inc. are not liable for injury, theft or damage to any person, property or animal. Signature on entry form constitutes agreement herein.
3. **Judges' decisions are final.** No exhibitor or person shall heckle or approach a judge for any reason. Permission to speak with a judge may be obtained from the Horse Show Supervisor or ring staff if the judge is agreeable. While the show is in progress, only authorized persons are permitted in the ring. Any exhibitor or representative disregarding this rule will cause the disqualification of the exhibitor, the forfeiture of all entry fees, and may be asked to leave the area. Show management reserves the right to change judging assignments.
4. **Show Management decisions are final.** No exhibitor or person shall behave in a disruptive manner towards show staff. Any exhibitor or representative disregarding this rule will cause the disqualification of the exhibitor, the forfeiture of all entry fees, and may be asked to leave the area.
5. Management reserves the right to cancel, combine, divide, limit size or move classes.
6. Failure to comply with the rules/regulations in effect will result in forfeiture of fees and expulsion from the Fairgrounds.
7. Rider's age will be the age they were on December 1, 2024.
8. The age of a horse shall be computed on the basis of a calendar year starting January 1 of the year foaled. It is a weanling during the calendar year of foaling date, regardless of the time of year foaled.
9. The following point system will be used: 1st: 10 points 2nd: 8 points 3rd: 7 points 4th: 6 points 5th: 5 points 6th: 4 points 7th: 3 points 8th: 2 points. **Medal Class points** are as follows: 1st 10 points, 2nd 6 points, 3rd 4 points, 4th 2 points, 5th 1 point, 6th 0.5 point. **Championship classes and Classics are worth double and Premium Classic Classes are triple points.**
10. **Day-end and weekend division** awards are based on a **team** of the same horse and rider, with the exception of the Registered breed divisions, which are based on the horse only.
11. Exhibitors must have proof of proper registration for horses being shown in Registered Breed classes.
12. Riders must have a number presented to the judge while exhibiting in a class. The number must be on the exhibitor or on both sides of the saddle pad, if using your own number system. **Any exhibitor entering the ring without a number or wearing an incorrect number, will be disqualified.**
13. Any Exhibitor showing in a class they have not entered/added **will be charged double** the entry fee.
14. **2-minute tack change holds only for legitimate tack changes to be requested at the GATE.** Tack changes must be done at ringside and will not exceed 2 minutes. Please plan accordingly.
15. Bits may be checked at the discretion of the judge.
16. Cell phones or any other communication device are not allowed in the ring.
17. Headers are permitted and encouraged for Walk-Trot and Beginner exhibitors during the lineup, pinning and exit from the arena. With permission from the judge, any other rider may also use a header for assistance during line-up and pinning.
18. Schooling of horses is permitted only in authorized areas and times. No schooling or horses near the barns, spectator areas or concession area. Courteous behavior is expected from all exhibitors.
19. Action devices are prohibited anywhere on the show grounds.
20. All Hunt Seat riders are required to wear ASTM approved helmets with a harness whenever riding over fences.
21. All riders must have appropriate footwear whenever mounted.
22. No person can ride bareback or with halter and lead lines on the fairgrounds. Riding double is expressly prohibited.
23. Stallions may be shown / handled by exhibitors over 18.

24. The following are prohibited and cause for expulsion from the fairgrounds and forfeiture of fees:
- + Alcoholic beverages are not permitted on the premises.
 - + Smoking is not permitted in the tents or stalls.
 - + Grilling or open fires are not permitted anywhere in or around the tents and stalls.
 - + 4-wheelers, ATVs, or skateboards are not allowed.
 - + Harassment, heckling, taunting, abusive behavior and/or foul language will not be tolerated
 - + Abuse of horses will not be tolerated.
25. No dogs are allowed on the horse show grounds.
PLEASE LEAVE YOUR DOGS AT HOME.
26. The exhibitor must clean up after their horse and deposit manure in the designated area.

- + Declined cards will be charged a \$50 penalty fee and all remaining classes will be scratched or another form of payment must be supplied.
- + Remaining balances may result in legal action and suspension from future participation in the horse show.

- + Failure to settle an account by the end of the show will result in a \$50 late fee.
- + One Woodstock Fair admission pass will be issued to each exhibitor per day of showing; maximum 4 passes.
- + **No refunds** for scratched or missed classes except with a veterinarian's or physician's note. The note must be postmarked by September 09, 2025. Refunds will be issued, minus the office fee.
- + **No refunds** will be issued for stalls canceled after August 1, 2025. You may sublet a stall with the understanding that you are still the responsible party.
- + **No refunds** of any kind for any reason will be issued after September 30, 2025.

- + Proof of Coggins & Rabies within 1 year, Health Certificate within 30 days or a Fair and Show Certificate for out of state horses, Vaccine Form signed by Veterinarian or Receipt of vaccines, and Breed Registration papers (if applicable) **MUST** be dropped into the google drive folder sent to you by the show secretary once your entry has been accepted as a Pre entry to be considered Complete.
- + If entries are not complete by the closing date, there will be an incomplete entry fee.
- + **Entries received after the closing date will be considered post-entry and will be charged a post-entry fee.**
- + Classes will have limits of 18 for walk trot, beginner, and green horse classes in Ring 2 and Hunter Type Walk Trot in Ring 1. Class limits for all other classes will be 25 in Ring 2 and 28 in Ring 1.
- + **Online Add/Scratches** must be done in sessions. AM classes must be done by 8pm the night before. Afternoon sessions must be done by 9am the morning of, and PM classes must be done by 2pm the day of online @ <https://woodstock.showgroundslive.com/>.
- + **All adds and scratches outside above timelines must come to the secretary's booth.**

Stabling:

- + Names and stall assignments will be posted on Facebook at **Woodstock Fair Horse Shows**
<https://www.facebook.com/profile.php?id=61572438929654>
as well as the show office.
- + If you sublet a stall to someone, you must notify the show office in writing by August 27, 2025, with who the exhibitor is and what the horse's name is. All rules apply. You will still be the responsible party for that stall.
- + Any exhibitor using a stall not assigned/sublet to them or tampering with the stall assignments will be charged a **\$275.00** fee and must vacate the stall.
- + No person shall enter any stall other than their own without the express permission of the owner.
- + Stalls will be of the shed row type. There is no dismantling of the stalls for any reason, including stall decorating.
- + Stalls are available Thursday, August 28, 2025, from 8:00 am to 4:00 PM for decorating, deliveries of equipment, and supplies only. **NO HORSES allowed on Thursday!** This is due to the Fair's new opening night Fireworks Display.
- + Horses can move on August 29, 2025, starting at 6:00 am.
- + Stalls must be vacated by Monday, September 1, 2025, at 8:00 pm.
- + No mounting or riding of horses in the tent aisles or stalls. No use of whips in the stalls or aisles.
- + All horse trailers will be parked in a designated area on Stonebridge Rd. All horses must be stabled after show hours.
- + No temporary paddocks are allowed.
- + Do not overload or tamper with electrical outlets and/or stall lighting, or you will be asked to leave the show grounds. Do not use extension cords in an unsafe manner.
- + Hosing/washing of horses must be done in the wash area. Do not bathe horses near the stalls. Do not tie your horse to water pipes.
- + Shavings bags are recyclable. Please put shavings bags in the designated location; do not discard them in rubbish containers.
- + **All stalls must be stripped and cleaned before vacating. Failure to remove all waste will result in increased stall fees for future shows.**

Parking:

- + **Once unloaded, empty trailers will be parked in the Stonebridge lot. They cannot remain on the horse show grounds. Please plan accordingly for tack storage needs.**
- + **Only pre-entered exhibitors** with horses stabled on the grounds are entitled to one 4-day Fair parking sticker. Parking stickers can be picked up on Thursday, August 29, 2025, between 8 am and 4 PM. Parking stickers can be mailed at your expense.
- + Lost or forgotten parking stickers will not be replaced. The parking sticker **MUST** be affixed to the lower left corner of the windshield. Stickers not affixed will not be accepted.
- + **All Trainers will receive 1 parking sticker, whether exhibiting or not.**
- + Multiple vehicles accompanying the exhibitor **will not** be issued a parking sticker. Daily parking stickers can be purchased for \$5.
- + **All day trailers must be parked in the designated area and will be charged a \$10.00/day parking fee.**
Cars accompanying a day trailer will be directed to park in the parking area and pay the \$5.00 parking fee at the gate.
- + Day of show post entry day trailer parking will be charged at the gate. Cars accompanying this day trailer will be directed to park in the parking area and pay the \$5.00 parking fee at the gate.
- + All vehicles must be parked as directed by the Parking Department.
- + Parking of vehicles will not be allowed in any of the stalls/barn areas at any time.
- + Vehicle access for unloading of grain, hay, etc. will be allowed before 7:00 a.m. Please plan accordingly.
- + Trailer access to load/unload horses in the stall/barn area while the show is in progress is **prohibited**.
- + Trailers arriving during show hours will need to unload in the Day Parking Area.
- + Failure to comply will result in forfeiture of fees and expulsion from the Woodstock Fair.

FRIDAY CLASSICS

RING 3:

037. Open 3-Barrel Race Premium Classic

038. Open Tag Team 3-Barrel Premium Classic: Average time for both riders on the team will determine placing. Enter under one exhibitor's number.

RING 2:

019. Youth Walk-Trot Pleasure Classic: Open to Walk-Trot exhibitors ages 17 & under in all disciplines.

020. Beginner Walk-Trot-Canter Pleasure Classic

021. Pro-Am Walk-Trot Equitation Premium Classic: A walk-trot Classic open to all exhibitors in all disciplines. Professionals ride the first way of the ring, and amateurs ride the second way of the ring. Only the pros and amateurs are allowed into the ring during the class. The non-mounted rider will remain in the middle of the ring while the mounted rider is competing. Communication is NOT permitted at ANY point between riders. Enter under the amateur exhibitor's number.

Saturday Classics

RING 1:

073. Open Hunter on the Flat Pleasure Classic: Open to any exhibitor of any age. Extension of gaits may be requested.

074. Lucy Tisdale Memorial Hunter Derby Premium Classic

This is a two-round class open to anyone to be shown over a course of ten fences at 2'3" with higher options. The first round judged on performance, hunter pace, style, quality and substance, and movement. The course should include at least one in and out, one bending line, and one unrelated distance. The obstacles are to simulate those found in a hunt field. Natural obstacles may be used. The top 4 or 25% from the first will return to jump a handy hunter round of eight obstacles, which may include at least two of the following: trot jump, tight turn option, clever options for jump approach, halt, and/or back and walk jump. To be judged on style, brilliance, and handiness. The score will be the total of the two rounds. To fill a class, at least 4 riders must compete.

075. Pro-Am Hunter O/F Premium Classic 2': This is a classic open to a team of one professional and one non-professional exhibitor of any age with no height restriction on horse/pony. This is a two-rider class. The Pro rider will ride the posted course first, and then the amateur rider will do the same on the same horse/pony. To be shown over a course of 8-10 fences set at 2'0". The score will be based on the total points for both riders. Enter under the amateur exhibitor's number.

RING 2:

124. Side Saddle Pleasure Classic

125. Registered Stock Horse Pleasure Classic

126. Pro-Am Open Pleasure Premium Classic: A walk-trot-canter Classic open to all exhibitors in all disciplines. Professionals ride the first way of the ring, and amateurs ride the second way of the ring. Only the pros and amateurs are allowed into the ring during the class. The non-mounted rider will remain in the middle of the ring while the mounted rider is competing. Communication is NOT permitted at ANY point between riders. Enter under the amateur exhibitor's number.

127. Adult Walk-Trot Pleasure Classic

128. Open Adult Pleasure Classic

129. Am-Am Pleasure Premium Classic: A walk-trot-canter Classic open to all amateur exhibitors in all disciplines. One amateur rides the first way of the ring, and the other amateur rides the second way of the ring. Only the riders are allowed into the ring during the class. The non-mounted rider will remain in the middle of the ring while the mounted rider is competing. Communication is NOT permitted at ANY point between riders. Enter under one exhibitor's number.

130. Open Equitation Classic: Open to Junior and Amateur Adult exhibitors. The judges' top ten will be asked to do a pattern that may or may not be posted at the judges' discretion.

Sunday Classics

RING 1:

149. Equitation Over Fences Classic: Open to Junior and Amateur Adult exhibitors. A competition over 8-10 fences at 2'3".

150. Am-Am Equitation O/F Premium Classic 2': This is a classic open to all NON-PROFESSIONAL exhibitors of any age with no height restriction on horse/pony. This is a two-rider class. The first rider will ride the posted course, and then the second rider will do the same on the same horse/pony. To be shown over a course of 8-10 fences set at 2'0". The score will be based on the total points for both riders.

RING 2:

206. Open Pleasure Classic

207. Pet Pony Classic

208. Registered Light Horse Open Pleasure Classic

209. Open Junior Pleasure Classic

210. Versatility Horse Premium Classic:

Open to all exhibitors. This class will be run in three sections - Gymkhana, Western Pleasure, and Hunter Hack. Each section will be judged separately by two judges on 6 cards. Bridles may be changed between Gymkhana and Western Pleasure with the ok from the ring attendant with a two-minute timer. Following the Western portion, there will be a timed 3-minute break to prepare for tack and attire change inside the show ring. ASTM/SEI-approved helmets with harnesses are required for Hunter Hack. Grooms are to be ready at the gate. **No more than three grooms will be allowed to assist each rider.**

High Point Weekend Awards

The **Hi Point Trainer** award is based on the **total** points earned by all their students in **all** classes entered. This is not a team award, and all classes count, regardless of how many horses/ponies/Students a trainer may have. The trainer does not need to be present at the time of the presentation to win these awards.

The **Hi Point Exhibitor** award is based on the **total** points earned by an exhibitor in **all** classes entered. This is not a team award, and all classes count, regardless of how many horses/ponies an exhibitor may ride/drive/exhibit. Exhibitors need not be present at the time of the presentation to win these awards.

The **Hi Point Horse** award is based on the **total** points earned by a horse in **all** classes entered. This is not a team award, and all classes count, regardless of how many exhibitors/handlers ride/drive/exhibit the horses. Horses need not be present at the time of the presentation to win these awards.

The **Hi Point Pony** award is based on the **total** points earned by a pony in **all** classes entered. This is not a team award, and all classes count, regardless of how many exhibitors/handlers ride/drive/exhibit the pony. Pony need not be present at the time of the presentation to win these awards.

25 Weekend Hi Point Division Awards are based on the **total** points earned in all classes offered in the divisions throughout the weekend. The Light Horse and Stock Horse Week-End Hi Point awards are based on the horse, which may be exhibited by more than one exhibitor in the classes offered in these Divisions throughout the weekend. All other Division Weekend Hi Point awards are based on a **team** of the same horse/rider combination for all classes offered in the divisions throughout the weekend. **Must show in at least 1 class more than half of the classes offered.**

Day End Champions - 79 Day End Champions are based on the **total** points earned in all classes offered in the divisions throughout the weekend. The **Light Horse** and **Stock Horse** Week-End Hi Point awards are **based on the horse**, which may be exhibited by more than one exhibitor in the classes offered in these Divisions throughout the weekend. **All other** Division Week-End Hi Point awards are based on a **team** of the same horse/rider combination for all classes offered in the divisions throughout the weekend. **All Day End Champions must show in 1 class more than half of the classes offered.**

Judges Choice Awards - 10 awards, one from each judge each day. The judges will pick their favorite horse/rider combination for this award. No Entry fee. You don't have to be a ribbon winner to be eligible.

Circuit Awards

39 Circuit Hi Point Division Awards are based on the **total** points earned in all classes offered in the divisions throughout the show circuit. The Light Horse and Stock Horse Circuit Hi Point awards are based on the horse, which may be exhibited by more than one exhibitor in the classes offered in these Divisions throughout the circuit. All other Circuit Hi Point Division awards are based on a **team** of the same horse/rider combination for all classes offered in the divisions throughout the circuit. **You must have shown in at least 2 of the 3 shows (April, June, and Fair) to qualify.**

Must earn 12 points to qualify. One last chance to earn points on August 31.

Woodstock Fair Equitation O/F Medal Final

The class consists of two phases. The first phase is over obstacles, and the second phase is on the flat, with each phase counting 50%. To win a ribbon, a rider must complete both phases. The judge will select at least six contestants, if available, to compete in the second phase at a walk, trot, and canter. The same horse/pony shall be shown by the same rider in all phases. For any class to count, at least three riders must complete both phases of the class. Exhibitors may compete in only one Medal Class. **12 points needed to Qualify.**

Monday

- 221. WFHS 18" Medal Final
- 230. WFHS 2' Medal Final
- 235. WFHS 2'3" Medal Final

Woodstock Fair Flat Equitation Medal Final

Open to Junior or Amateur adults. All contestants are to show at the walk, trot, and canter both ways of the ring. To fill a class, three (3) competitors must show and be judged with proper appointments. At least the top four contestants are then required to perform one of the following tests. **12 points needed to Qualify.**

Test A On the straight away of the ring ONLY: Trot the first 1/3 on the correct diagonal; Canter the second 1/3 on the correct lead; Trot the final 1/3 on the incorrect diagonal. Return to the lineup at a trot down either rail.

Test B Trot to the center of the far end of the ring, demonstrating two changes of diagonal. Canter a Circle; Trot down the other side of the ring; Back to the lineup at a sitting trot.

Monday

Horses should be ridden with light contact or on a loose rein but not on a full drape. Posting or standing in the stirrups at extended jog is acceptable. Pattern class can include but not limited to changes of gait, lead changes (simple or flying), changes of direction, back, 360 degree turns and extension of gait. Rail class will be judged on walk, jog, lope with extensions in both jog and lope in at least one direction. Other movements which may be asked at the judge's discretion is but not limited to: halt, stop, back, one change of direction at the jog, side pass, turns of 360 degrees, or change of lead. Passing of horses is permissible and should not be penalized if the horse maintains rhythm and cadence.
